		After the open forum, Atty. Monares recapitulated the issues and concerns raised by the participants. Engr. Carlo Vic Arida of DENR-EMB Central Office explained to the public the subsequent steps or activities in relation to ECC application of the company.

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

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

# Briefing and Orientation on the Purpose of the Public Hearing

#### A. General Considerations

- Public Hearing is a <u>formal process</u> that is initiated, planned and conducted by the DENR to promote dialogue or communication <u>between and among the project proponent</u>, the DENR and the public for the purpose of exchanging information and views. It provides a forum for the proponent and the DENR to understand community values or needs and appropriately respond to them. It serves as a venue to test alternative options for resolution of issues or conflicts.
- It should be noted that the Public Hearing is not the appropriate venue to ensure that the findings of the EIA study had been communicated to the stakeholders.

#### B. Pre-Public Hearing

- In coordination with DENR, the proponent at its own expense shall cause the publication of a notice of public hearing once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks in any newspaper of general circulation with the second publication undertaken at least 15 days prior to the scheduled hearing.
- · The DENR shall conduct the public hearing with the assistance of the proponent and preparer.
- · Public hearings shall be open, without the need for a formal invitation, to all interested groups
- Provision of EIA Report copies to the public (1 copy of EIA Report to EMB, host Municipality, Executive summary for barangays, offices/libraries)
- · Selection of a Public Hearing Venue venue must be neutral, i.e., it is not identified or associated with a party.
- · EMB Director of DENR-RD shall designate Hearing Officer.

### Geology/Geomorphology

Proposed project area is underlain by interbedded sedimentary rocks composed of well-indurated and massive conglomerate with bedded sandstone and siltstone, and limestone (larger than 2mm in diameter).

Natural Pozzolan deposit occur within the project area and it is represented by massive siliceous, vitric tuff and tuffaceous shale deposit that are found interbedded with sandstone and siltstone greywacke belonging to Middle Miocene Formation.

 The project area lies along a moderately sloping to fairly rugged topography; with some portions having rolling sedimentary complex and isolated prominent limestone cap.

Relief is moderate to high, characterized by steep slopes and V-shaped valleys with elevation ranges from 100 to over 300 m above sea level (masi). It is characterized by NE to SW trending closely-spaced, steep contours giving more than 30 to 50% slope with narrow ridges containing resistant peaks and oftentimes overlain by young siliceous beds and limestone unit.

 Two major water bodies dissected the property at its northern and central
portion. The East-West trending Tangon River (Danao River) dissected the propert
at its northern portion and drains its load towards Camotes Sea. Tangon Creek, a
major tributary of Tangon River (Danao River) that flows northward, dissected the
central portion of the project site. perty

\* The major stream is waterlogged throughout the year while most of the minor tributaries and/or creeks tend to be dry and waterlogged only during rainy season





### Pedology



Three [3] of the soil sampling locations within and outside the MPSA 155-2000 VII belongs to the Faraon series while the other two (2) belongs to the Baguio series.
 Faraon series are black and usually clayey with fair drainage.

pH of the soil is generally neutral in terms of soil reaction; except those at the Sta. Rosa site where surface soil reaction is slightly acidic. Meaning, mineral nutrients are readily available to plants.

Soll in the project area are deficient in organic matter content, has low nitrogen content and available phosphorus.
 Calcium is high in all of the sites while highest Mg content was observed at the Sta. Rosa sampling site.

The soils of the project area also have a very low to very high level of Exchangeable K; sodium levels are medium to high.

Two (2) soil sampling sites exhibited very low cadmium content and high hexavalent Chromium (Cr<sup>+0</sup>) content and elevated levels of mercury under its undisturbed stage.

Water holding capacity of the project area ranges from moderate to high.



### Terrestrial Ecology

• Generally, the forest cover of the project area varies from closed-canopy to open canopy forest and some portions of brushlands. The closed-canopy forest were second-growth and residual forest dominated with Euphorbiacea and Moraceae family tree species.

 Flora (Tanum). A total of one hundred sixty-four (164) species were recognized belonging to the seed plants, ferns and their allies from the seven quadrats sampled. Out of the said species, twenty-two (22) were Philippine endemics and eight (8) species are included in the National Red List.

 Fauna (Mananap). Twenty-eight (28) species with 552 individuals of terrestrial vertebrate fauna were identified.



### Hydrology/Hydrogeology



 The project area can be found within the Tangon Watershed, which is adjacent to the Balamban and Kotkot Principal River Basins that bounds the western and southern portions of the Tangon Watershed, respectively.

 Area is also generally underlain by good waterbearing rock units or aquifer consist of sedimentary beds of sandstone, conglomerate and isolated caps of limestone. The inherent primary structures in the form of bedding developed in sandstone units and porous limestone, and its secondary structures in the form of fractures/joints or discontinuities serve as good permeable network for groundwater flow in the rock formation.

 There were no occurrence of caves and sinkholes but presence of spring and seepage were observed; indicating groundwater flow in the project area.

 Three (3) active springs were also noted occurring within the proposed mining blocks of the company.



### Water Quality

• Groundwater. All of the sampling stations for thermotolerant coliform bacteria and the total coliform contents showed elevated levels of contamination of coliform bacteria. pH, on the other hand, showed a near neutral to neutral pH and are all within the upper limit of the pH standard of PNSDW 2007. All stations also showed an acceptable TSS concentration and oil and grease content of less than 1.0 ppm. Laboratory analysis of Mercury, Arsenic Cadmium, Lead and Chromium revealed that all of the sampling stations are within the prescribed PNSDW 2007 standard.

 Surface water. Laboratory analysis results showed that all sampling stations have low thermotolerant coliform bacteria and have a moderately alkaline pH. BOD and oil and grease are also within standards. Natural bodies of water around the proposed project site also do not contain elevated levels of heavy metals.

• Salt water. All of the parameters tested for the marine water quality indicated that the **marine water environment is within the acceptable** values of the prescribed standard of the DENR AO 2016-08.

### Freshwater Ecology

 Seventeen (17) species of phytoplanktons with 31,500 cell/mL in five different division were identified from the collected specimen during the sampling. (i.e. Bacteria, protest, single-celled plants)

 Bacillariophyta (algae) and Charophyta has the highest number of individual counts gathered 29% of the total percent composition of the species collected.

 A total of one hundred twenty-three (123) individuals where captured during the macroinvertebrate sampling.

 Ten (10) species of macroinvertebrates (ex. insect, worms, snails) that belong to seven (7) families in categorization where identified. (indication of healthy river/creeks)

 The upper stream has the highest number of species captured, with eight (8) species; second is the downstream (6 species); while the middle stream has 3 species in the overall counting.





### Climatology, Air Quality and Noise

 The project site falls under Type 3 climate wherein there is no very pronounced maximum rain period. The climatological normal values (1981-2010) recorded at Mactan International Airport Synoptic Station of PAGASA show an annual average rainfall of 1,564.5 mm, with high monthly averages during in June, July, September and October.

 The prevailing wind flows in the area are the northeast and southwest winds. The southwest monsoon (Habagat) predominates during the months of June to September while northeast monsoon (Amihan) from November to April. Easterly winds prevail in May during transition from northeast to southwest monsoon. The monthly average wind speed ranges from 2 to 3 m/s

 Based on Philippine vulnerability map to typhoons, the province of Cebu has low risk to typhoon.

 <u>Air Quality</u>. Ambient air quality monitoring showed that the ambient concentration levels of TSP, PM<sub>100</sub>, PM<sub>125</sub> SO<sub>27</sub> and NO<sub>2</sub> in all sampling stations were within the NAAAG values.  <u>Noise</u>. The result of the noise level monitoring showed that the average noise levels during daytime at Station N1 (Cabungahan Basketball Court) were lower the maximum allowable noise (55 dB(A)) set by DENR for category A areas (i.e. residential area). However, average noise levels during morning, evening and nighttime were higher the maximum allowable noise for each respective period (i.e. 50 dB(A) for morning and evening, and 45 dB(A) for nighttime.

 The average noise levels at Station N2 (Mining Site) were lower compared to the maximum allowable noise level set by DENR for category D areas (i.e. heavy industrial area).

 For Station N3 (Cabungahan Elementary School), the average noise levels during daytime, evening, nighttime and morning were higher compared to maximum allowable noise level set by DENR for each respective period in category AA areas (i.e. area which requires quietness, such as areas within 100 meters from school site, nursery schools, hospitals and special house for the aged).

 The average noise levels at Station N4 (Sitio Timobo Gym) were lower than the maximum allowable noise set by DENR for daytime period in category A areas. However, average noise levels during morning, evening and nighttime higher than the maximum allowable noise set for each respective period.

### Socio-Economic


• Danao City is considered as the 5<sup>th</sup> highest populated area among the thirteen (13) cities and municipalities of Metro Cebu. As of 2015, Danao has a total population of 136,417 with 14 percent increase if compared to 2010 census.

• It has a complete land area of 16,871 hectares and approximately 6,102.50 hectares (36.71%) are devoted for multiple agricultural crops. Corn is the City's primary commodity; comprising 38.59 percent or 2,355 hectares dedicated for maize production. Another major crop is vegetables with 1,217 hectares (19.94%) of the total cultivated areas.

 Based on the conducted survey, majority of household-respondents (91.7%) are aware of the company's proposed project.

 In addition, majority of the household-respondents are also in favor of the project. Most of them (45%) believe that it will create employment opportunities. Others also assumed that it will generate livelihood and business opportunities (14.5%), additional income for the barangay and the city (19.4%), and could trigger social development projects in the barangay (21%).
