SECTION 1

PROJECT OVERVIEW

- ¹ Advantage Concrete Industries Corp. (ACIC) intended to amend its existing ECC (ECC-CO-1903-0010) to include the following activities in their operation:
 - i. Increase its clinker production capacity to 11.52 Million Metric Tons Per Year (MMTPY) and cement production capacity to 19.2 MMTPY.
 - ii. Expand cement plant complex area to 120 hectares.
 - iii. Increase extraction rate of limestone and shale within MPSA No. 071-97-IV to 19.2 MMTPY and 3.6 MMTPY, respectively.
 - iv. Expansion of quarry areas to 574 hectares but still within MPSA No. 071-97-IV; and
 - v. Increase its annual cement production capacity to 10.6 Million Metric Tons Per Year (MMTPY); and
 - vi. Construction and operation of pier facility for the delivery of raw materials and transport of the cement products.
- ² The proposed expansion activities were confined within Barangays Baha, Talibayog, Hukay, Carlosa, and Encarnacion, Municipality of Calatagan in the Province of Batangas.


