#### 1 INTRODUCTION

The FDC Misamis Power Corporation (FDCMPC) currently owns and operates a 3 X 135 MW circulating fluidized bed (CFB) coal-fired power plant in Villanueva, Misamis Oriental. Since its commercial operation in 2016, Mindanao has shown strong economic growth, faster than the national average, and with this comes increased energy requirements necessary to sustain this growth. FDCMPC is proposing to expand its current facility with another 3 X 135 MW power generating units to contribute to the region's continued development. Total plant capacity will reach 6 X 135 MW with the planned expansion. Moreover, this expansion project shall benefit the national and local government by generating revenues, boosting local employment, increasing livelihood opportunities and its multiplier effects, and improving carbon sink through reforestation programs. FDCMPC also foresees an increase in the Social Development Program (SDP) allocation with the growth in revenues arising from the expansion of operations.

The expansion project will still be located inside the FDCMPC compound in Barangays Tambobong and Balacanas inside the PHIVIDEC Industrial Estate in Villanueva and Tagoloan, Misamis Oriental.

In compliance with the DENR Administrative Order 2017-15: Guidelines on Public Participation under the Philippine Environmental Impact Statement System (PEISS), the conduct of Public Hearing is required for all Environmentally Critical Projects (ECPs) and is a formal process initiated and conducted by DENR-EMB to promote dialogues and communication between and among the project proponent, DENR-EMB, relevant government agencies, LGUs, and stakeholders.

Furthermore, in compliance with the DENR-EMB Memorandum Circular No. 2020-30: Interim Guidelines on Public Participation in the Implementation of the PEISS (PD 1586) during the State of National Public Health Emergency, public consultations may be conducted using one or combination of two options:

1) The Proponent is allowed to conduct public hearing with project's major stakeholders through video conferencing for not less than two hours, with sufficient time for open forum

and discussion of EIA results with mitigating measures as provided in its Environmental Impact Statement Study (EIS) or Environmental Performance Report and Management Plan (EPRMP);

2) The Proponent shall undertake public hearing by sector in small groups following the minimum health standards recommended by the IATF. All documentation materials, including video conferencing recordings shall be submitted to DENR-EMB. For this project, the Proponent opted to conduct the video conferencing options in consideration of the current COVID-19 situation on the province and to comply with the health protocol of IATF.

This Public Hearing Documentation Report summarizes the notification methods, presentation of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) results, and the comments, issues, and concerns received at the Public Hearing, both in the actual venue and Zoom.




Figure 2-1. Posting of Notices in Barangay and Municipal offices

The program officially started at 9:20 AM with the acknowledgment of participants led by Engr. Dexter Tabada of DENR-EMB Central Office and Ms. Analiza Miso of FDCMPC. Opening prayer and singing

of the national anthem followed. Barangay Chairman of Barangay Tambobong Hon. Regene Ello gave the welcome remarks.

Engr. Dexter Tabada briefed and gave an orientation to the participants about the Philippine Environmental Impact Statement System and the purpose of the Public Hearing. Atty. Abbas Lao then made a presentation on the house rules for the conduct of the public hearing activity.

Before the Project presentation, as indicated in the program, Atty. Reeza Singson of the Philippine Movement for Climate Justice (PMCJ) raised the matter of validity of the public hearing itself. She cited the following reasons for raising the issue, i.e., claim that the stakeholders were not properly informed of the content of the EPRMP Report, they were not provided with hard copies of the report, and that the notices for the public hearing were claimed to be insufficient. Discussions followed whereby proofs of notice in the newspaper were presented and that the stakeholders were provided the link by which they could access the EPRMP Report. Finally, the Hearing Officer ruled that these issues were under the jurisdiction of the EMB Central Office and that he would transmit these to the EMB Central Office for proper disposition. The program proceeded as scheduled after the ruling.

FDCMPC discussed the description of the proposed project. Ms. Analiza Miso presented the company overview of the FDCMPC and its existing Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Programs. Engr. Roy Perolino then made a presentation on the proposed 6 x 135 Circulating Fluidized Bed Coal-Fired Power Plant Project description.

The results of the Environmental Impact Assessment were presented by Dr. Edgardo G. Alabastro, Team Leader of the EIA Preparer from Technotrix Integrated Services Corp.

After the presentations, Atty. Abbas Lao facilitated the open forum and summarized the issues and concerns gathered during the public hearing. Engr. Dexter Tabada closed the activity with the presentation of the ways forward of the EIA Process. The public hearing officially adjourned at 1:45 PM.




Figure 3. Acknowledgement of Participants in Zoom




Figure 4. Welcome Remarks from Barangay Chairman of Tambobong – Hon Regene Ello




Figure 5. Presentation of the Philippine Environmental Impact Statement System





Figure 6. Presentation of FDCMPC's proposed 6 x 135 MW Circulating Fluidized Bed Coal-Fired Power Plant Project.






Figure 7. Presentation of EIA Results / Environmental Performance and Management Plan of the Proposed 6 x 135 MW Circulating Fluidized Bed Coal-Fired Power Plant Project.




Figure 8. Participants raising Issues and Concerns during the Open Forum

#### 3.3 PUBLIC HEARING COMMENTS

The Open Forum, facilitated by Atty. Abbas Lao – Public Hearing Officer, served as a venue for participants to ask, clarify, suggest, and/or comment on their issues and concerns about the proposed project. Before Atty Lao, proceeded with the Open Forum, he reiterated that there is a continuous opposition presented by Atty Riza Singson of PMCJ and Mr. Chito Trillanes and other members of PCMJ questioning the publication of the public hearing and furnishing of the EIS documents to the concerned Barangays. Atty. Lao mentioned that he previously ruled that it is already recognized the continuous opposition to the said proceeding without prejudice with the final decision of EMB Central.

The Public Hearing Officer reminded the participants regarding the guidelines to properly identify themselves (name, organization and/or position) before airing their clarifications, questions,

comments, and concerns. The participants were also informed that the open forum would be documented through audio and video recordings to note their statements and the Proponent's responses accurately.

The issues and concerns raised during the public hearing are enumerated below:

Socio-Economic:

- Percentage of employment rate within the host municipality, particularly in Villanueva
- Distribution of ER 1-94 to the impact barangays and not just the host barangays
- Determination of Impact Barangays in the EIS study
- Clarification on 2019 and 2020 real property taxes

Health:

• The health impacts of the proposed project are not expounded in the presentation

Land:

• Ash Disposal and carbon footprint

Air:

- Quantification of the fly ash emission
- Carbon Sink Program

Water:

• Study on Coral and marine life



On 28 June 2021, the nation was probably amused by the story of a certain factory employee in Valenzuela City who vented his disappointment and frustration with his employer over the fact that the latter paid his salary of one thousand fifty-six pesos (P1,056) in 5 and 10 centavo coins. The nation wondered what could the employee have done against the employer? Did the employee have the right to refuse? Could the employee vindicate himself against the apparent insult dished out by his employer in some form of legal action?



in some form of legal action? Well, for starters, people should know that under Section 52 of Republic Act 7653, all Philippine currency notes, bills and coins, may be used in payment for almost everything as they are guaranteed by Our starter of the start

the Government of the Republic of the Philippines as legal tender. Like everything else, however, such is subject to certain limitations. For coins, the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas through BSP Circular 537, Series of 2006, set a maximum amount for payment in coins to be considered legal tender. For 1-Piso, 5-Piso, and 10-Piso coins, you can only offer such number of coins as will total one thousand pesos (P1,000) for payment to be considered legal tender. Meanwhile, for 1-centavo, 5-centavo, 10-centavo, and 25-centavo coins, you may only use enough coins as will and my appreciation of the same. My opinion may vary when other facts are changed.







 The graph show the plot of the measured NOX (as NO2) and SOX (as SO2) from January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2020 using CEMS at the stacks of Units 1, 2, and 3. Measured one-hour average stack gas concentrations of SOX, NOX, CO, O2, PM and OPACITY were generally within the emission standards as shown in the Table.

 Based on FDC MPC records, The observed negative value of the Oxygen in the report was due to the malfunction of the card in the machine. EMB was informed of the incident through notification letters and compliance plan. Corrective measures were made in coordination with the equipment supplier.

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
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

# 194 Engr. Dexter Tabada:

195 Ma'am I think po pwede po nating iaddress po during the public forum para lang po at least 196 madiscuss muna po itong project, then later po sagutin natin itong mga questions po ninyo.

Sir, kasi preliminary po and mga tanong ko Sir. So kung maari po ay masagot muna ng proponent
 ngayon. Kasi kung wala po itong mga compliant with the jurisdictional requirements ay hindi po
 maaring magtuloy-tuloy ang public hearing na ito ayon po sa batas.

## 202 Engr. Dexter Tabada:

Ma'am Reeza Singson, while we recognized your question very significant and very important, we will just consider it as kwan na lang, so as mentioned by Dexter, we will answer it, we will require the project proponent during the open forum. We will just give the opportunity, considering that we have already organized this public consultation. It was already published in the website of the 225 Environmental Management Bureau. I think we will just pursue with the public consultation and then if you have some question, questioning the legality of the proceedings, you may put it in writing and 226 227 submit it to EMB Central Office, so that they can considered. Hindi pa naman approved itong kwan e, considering the number of participants who are present, I think this is a good opportunity to 228 229 continue the public hearing. 230 231 Atty. Reeza Singson: 232 I understand that Atty. But considering that we will sit here for a couple of hours for this public hearing, 233 I think it is important that we know first, if this public hearing is legal. So to do to that, may we know 234 if the jurisdiction of the requirement have been complied with, otherwise this public hearing will be 235 put in question later on kung legal po ba ang public hearing na ito o hindi, kung nakapag comply po 236 ba ang proponent sa jurisdictional requirements o hindi bago po isagawa ang public hearing. 237 238 **MENRO Villanueva:** 239 Sir, this is MENRO Villanueva, can I bat in? 240 241 Atty. Abbas Lao: 242 Yes, MENRO. Dexter the MENRO Villanueva is asking for kung mag a..... 243 244 **MENRO Villanueva:** 245 Can I Sir? 246 247 Atty. Abbas Lao: 248 Dexter, are you still in? 249 250 Engr. Dexter Tabada: 251 Hello Sir, sorry sir 252 253 Atty. Abbas Lao: 254 Yes, the MENRO Villanueva is a raising his a.... 255 256 **MENRO Villanueva:** 257 Can I Sir? 258 Engr. Dexter Tabada: 259 260 Sige po sir, go ahead po. 261 262 **MENRO** Villanueva: 263 We the stakeholders of Villanueva received and even the PEMAPS ibinigay sa amin saka yung EIA, 264 so I think the question of Ms. Singson is already answered, and we have also seen in the website 265 that this scoping was published. That's all sir. 266 267 Atty. Reeza Singson: 268 Sir, I've heard you refer to the scoping as having been published, but the notice of this public hearing po, napublished po ba? For 2 consecutive weeks at least 7 days prior to this public hearing today. I 269 270 am asking the proponent and I hope the proponent can answer this simple question, Sir. Otherwise, I'll have to ask the hearing officer Mr. Tabada to defer this public hearing, because this would be 271 272 questionable without compliance with the jurisdictional requirements. 273 274 Engr. Dexter Tabada: 275 Hello ma'am, we can proceed naman po with the public hearing kasi this was already organized and 276 then a, EMB has allowed naman po yung ating a....for the conduct of this public hearing. 277

#### 278 Atty. Reeza Singson:

You realized of course sir that it would be illegal to proceed with this public hearing at this point on
 the proponent has not shown proof that they have with the jurisdictional requirements. If you proceed

with this public hearing right now, there may be some legal refer caution with respect to the publichearing itself and the project of the proponent as well as yourself.

## Atty. Abbas Lao:

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Anyway, Dexter I suggest that we will just consider the question raised by Ms. Reeza Singson as continuous opposition to this public hearing that will be resolve by EMB Central Office, as with regards to the continuation of this public hearing, I do suggest that considering the number of participants who have already registered in this virtual public hearing. We will proceed with the public hearing without prejudice of course to the question of ma'am Reeza Singson if it is really a valid ground for the cancellation of this public hearing. So let it be resolve by the EMB Central Office, Dexter.

## 293 Atty. Reeza Singson:

In that case Mr. Tabada, may I just register my ongoing, my continuous objection to the continuation
 of this public hearing. Also I would like to summarized, first, I asked the proponent for proof of their
 compliance with the jurisdictional requirements and No.2: that you allowed this public hearing just
 the same. Thank you.

#### 299 Ian Rivera

A, Mr. Chair, can I be recognized?

## 302 Engr. Dexter Tabada:

303 Sige po Sir, go ahead po.

#### 305 Ian Rivera

306 Good Morning to everyone, I am Ian Rivera, I am the national coordinator of Philippine Movement for Climate Justice and we've been to so many public hearing and public consultation all over the 307 country that our organization participated and the question of the process is really, really important 308 here (continued with visayan language)..... A while ago, Sir Dexter Tabada, showed us the 309 310 procedure, on how the EIS will be facilitated as part of PD 1586 and that procedure, part of that mentioned that all stakeholders those really, really affected should have participated and should be 311 312 well informed of the project that will be presented in this public hearing. Ok, so according to the law how will that be ensured, that all those stakeholders and those will be affected, that their concerns 313 314 will be heard in this public hearing. So that is in short the jurisdictional requirements.

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316 So yung jurisdictional requirements, yun yung magsigurado na yung mga affected, yung mga 317 barangays na impacted ay makapag aral bago sa public hearing kung ano ba itong proyekto na ito? 318 Intelligently, para handa silang magtanong at meron silang manggagaling sa kanilang mga interes no? So that's how important the jurisdictional requirement. Now, if you proceed with the presentation 319 of this project given there is a problem with the jurisdictional requirements, so how will the people, 320 particular those that will be directly affected can intelligently ask the question on the impacts and the 321 322 potential impacts. That's the point here of jurisdictional requirement, so if you proceed with this public hearing without compliance with the jurisdictional requirement, that will be prejudicial to the directly 323 affected and to those that have concern about the project. So, in the process, the EMB should made 324 325 it clear if the proponent has complied with the jurisdictional requirement, because that is really, really 326 important. So before starting with the business here, that should be cleared out first. Like I've heard, 327 are there barangays that would directly mentioned, there are 5 barangays. Are all the barangays that 328 are affected are here present, are the official and the citizens of those barangays were able to study 329 the EIS? Because that will be the discussion here. I am just clarifying the procedure which by the 330 way, Engr. Tabada, you are the one that clarified and presented on that. So I hope this is clear, 331 because EMB is entrusted to implement the law on the Presidential Degree 1586. 332

## 333 Engr. Dexter Tabada:

Kay Ms. Ana po, paki share po yung publication po natin, yung proof po.

# 335336 Ana Miso:

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Alright, good morning po.

#### 339 **Emmanoelle Feliciano:** 340 Yes, we can confirmed that we have published, the affidavit of publication is here, and that we have 341 given the invitation to different barangays. Thank you. 342 343 Atty. Reeza Singson: 344 May we ask about the date? Sorry about that, I just wanted to know about the date of the second 345 publication please, thank you. 346 347 **Emmanoelle Feliciano:** 348 July 9, wished to confirm the publication July 9, second publication. 349 350 Atty. Reeza Singson: Is it on the affidavit ma'am? 351 352 353 **Emmanoelle Feliciano:** 354 Yes, It is in the affidavit, Ms. Singson. 355 356 Atty. Reeza Singson: 357 Thank you, may we see the date please? The affidavit? 358 359 Engr. Dexter Tabada: 360 Hello Ma'am, can we now proceed with the presentation po? 361 362 **Emmanoelle Feliciano:** 363 Yes, Please. 364 365 Atty. Reeza Singson: 366 Mr. Tabada, there was an outstanding, I was asking about the date on the affidavit regarding the 2<sup>nd</sup> 367 publication 368 **Emmanoelle Feliciano:** 369 370 Yes, we're going to show it in a while, please give us some minute. 371 372 Atty. Reeza Singson: 373 Thank you. 374 375 **Chito Trillanes** 376 Mr. Tabada, can I be recognize? 377 378 Engr. Dexter Tabada: Yes, po Sir 379 380 381 **Chito Trillanes:**

382 By the way, I am Chito Trillanes a member of multi stakeholder group of the Philippine EITI the Extractive Industry Transparency Initiative that is a reviewing standard law on transparency, and I 383 384 subscribe to the query of the participants here relating to compliance with jurisdiction. Mr. Tabada, I 385 hope you will remember the fact that your office should have receive proofs of compliance for instance, you should have the copy of the publications not only the affidavit that is presented, 386 387 because that is part of the best evidence rule. When the law requires for a publication, your office 388 should have at hand the published document in a newspaper of general circulation in the area. Second, there was a question whether or not a hard copy of the EIS or any other instrument allowed 389 390 by DENR that should be furnished the host or impacted barangays. These stakeholders should have 391 receive that not only the MENRO because there is really clear. Sir I agree that we cannot proceed 392 with this public hearing without complying with this jurisdictional requirements. This is a regulation 393 that your agency is supposed to implement. So we do not question any presentation, but this is a

valid observation. The proponent and your agency is supposed to observe and follow your
 regulations. I'm sorry, but I really have to follow on with this because I am in-charged also in reviewing
 standards and how the agencies are implementing standards. Thank you po.

## 398 Engr. Dexter Tabada:

Sir, Noted po. Ma'am, I think napakita kanina yung affidavit nung publication.

## 401 Chito Trillanes:

402 But Sir, to your mind is the affidavit similar to the best evidence rule the published notice? So, if you 403 have been in the public hearing like this, you should have the idea if this will be equating to the 404 required publication?

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## 406 Atty. Renato Behimente:

Sir Dexter, FDC Misamis, Renato Behimente, may I be recognized?

#### 409 Engr. Dexter Tabada:

410 Yes Sir go ahead

## 412 Atty. Renato Behimente:

413 Sir, with the outstanding questions, may we request the hearing officer to have a ruling on this so 414 that we can proceed with the presentation as suggested? Thank you.

#### 416 Atty. Abbas Lao

Dexter, That is actually my point, the question of Atty. Reeza Singson was already addressed, the
project proponent has already shown to us the proof of publications, as raised by Atty. Chito Trillanes
in the conduct of the publications. I think, I suggest that they submit a formal petitions or complaint
before EMB Central Office so that they can rule the queries raised by the group of Atty. Trillanes and
Atty. Reeza Singson.

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423 We will just consider this as a continuous opposition to this public hearing, but as I have said considering the number of participants of which I think majority of the stakeholders in the identified 424 425 area if the project proponent is already registered they participation in this virtual public consultation, we will just continue to continue this publication and we will consider the question of the group of 426 427 Reeza Singson and Chito Trillanes as continuous opposition to this public hearing and let it be resolve by EMB Central Office. By the way, just to clarify, this is not just the opportunity for the any 428 429 opposition or any stakeholders to raised their concern before this project expansion, because they will still be given a chance to question any document, like for example the result of the Environmental 430 431 Impact Statement or EPRMP submitted by the project proponent. Because after this public hearing, 432 the EMB Central Office will still entertain any questions. This is not the end of any question pertaining 433 to the proposed expansion of this project.

## 435 Atty. Renato Behimente:

436 Dexter, can I have that 2<sup>nd</sup> opportunity, to ask for the proposed and be recognized?

#### 437 438 Engr. Dexter Tabada:

439 Go ahead Sir.

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# 441 Atty. Renato Behimente:442 With that may we move

With that may we move for the continue of the presentation proper, Sir Dexter and Atty. Lao

#### 444 Chito Trillanes:

Excuse me, can I be recognized?

# 446447 Engr. Dexter Tabada:

- 448 Go ahead Sir.
- 449

#### 450 lan Rivera:

451 As I mentioned a while ago, the issue of jurisdictional requirement should be cleared first before any motion to proceed. And the jurisdictional requirement is not just about the publication or there are 452 also other requirements. That should be cleared, so that as I have mentioned, so that the affected 453 454 communities, the residents of this project, they will be equip to intelligently asked a crucial questions in relations to impacts. Having said that, there is no clear decision yet about the publication. Is that 455 456 publication out in a general circulation? Second the affected barangay also given notices? And also the official of these barangays given and provided with an EIS? So those are just part of the 457 458 jurisdictional requirement. I think we should be clear this first, because if this recording is official, that should have established first. 459

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Yet, there is no decision from EMB if those jurisdictional requirements are complied by the proponent.

# 463 Atty. Abbas Lao:

464 Dexter, I think we have to understand that as far as EMB is concern, the project proponent have 465 already shown proof of compliance to publication and now as I have said, if you are questioning the 466 details that publication, I think it is proper to just submit your formal petition or complaint to EMB 467 Central because we cannot outright resolve your legal question here. Anyway, if eventually it will be 468 decided in favor of you that the publication is questionable, EMB Central Office can declare that this 469 public as invalid and we will organize another public hearing in order to give opportunity to all 470 stakeholder.

472 As far as, I am concern we will proceed with this public hearing, because marami na po yung 473 participant dito na nagregister and including your group sir Ian and Sir Chito and Ma'am Reeza 474 Singson. If you have opposition, yes we will put on record that you have continuously opposing this 475 proceeding. We will put that on record, so that it will be resolved eventually by EMB Central Office.

## 477 Ian Rivera:

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478 Yeah, thank you for that explanation Mr. Chair, our hearing officer and this is really really a question on the procedures because in many public hearing that we attended and of course it is EMB 479 480 conducting it, some hearing officer are very restrict relation to the jurisdictional requirement. In fact 481 there is one public hearing, we raised the issue of jurisdictional requirement and it has could been complied but it doesn't been complied and in fact there were information that not provided to the 482 483 concerned citizen that will be affected of the project, so the hearing officer went through vigorously 484 on the requirements in an online setup, so ..... (speak in Visayan Languange)....para makita ang mga nag raised of guestion kung nagcomply ba? But having said that, it hasn't been complied. So 485 486 the hearing officer defer the public hearing. Im sure it's in the records of DENR that public hearing. 487 It was just conducted last February this year. So that is why, what is your standard procedure here? 488 Because I thought that EMB, has a standard procedure in going to the public hearing according to 489 the Presidential Degree 1586. Because I'm surprise, the issue of the jurisdiction, the hearing officer 490 here just trust it off as not pertinent to the procedure and to proceed with the public hearing. So it 491 really repeats the purpose why we have jurisdictional requirements if those will not be complied, why 492 we proceed?

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# 494 Atty. Abbas Lao:

495 Sir Ian, I think napakita naman yung publication ng project proponent which is the main issue raised 496 by Atty, Reeza just to show the proof of publication, so it was already presented as shown in the participants that there is indeed publication made by the project proponent. Ang sa akin po, if you 497 are really questioning the details, we have already the proof, but if you want to still question the 498 499 details of the publication, and then I think, I suggest you submit a formal petition to the EMB Central 500 Office, because sila naman po yung mag resolve dun and with regards to this public hearing, we will just considered it as a continuous opposition sa proceedings and if ever eventually, the EMB Central 501 502 Office will resolve your petition, questioning the publication of this public hearing, then they can still 503 invalidate this proceedings and organized for another public hearing. As I have said, hindi naman po 504 yung opportunity to raise any issues pertaining to proposed project. So iyun lang po ang sa akin, 505 because I think we have also considered the presence of other stakeholders here. It is not really

506 xxxxxxx public hearing. Looking at the participants in the registered virtual public hearing, lahat po 507 ng stakeholders, lahat ng stakeholders are mayroon po silang representative ditto.

## 509 Atty. Reeza Singson:

510 Mr. Tabada, may be recognized?

#### 511 512 Engr. Dexter Tabada:

- 513 Ma'am, I think
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# 515 Engr. Carlo Arida:

516 From EMB Central Office, Sir to add lang po sa sinabi ni Atty. Lao, yung details of public hearing na 517 kina conduct natin ngayon, from the preparation up to the conduct will be posted sa website naming 518 no, the proponent will submit the public hearing documentation. So from that documentation, you can see the details nung process na pinagdaanan nung project bago sya maschedule sa public 519 520 hearing. So I suggest that, since the proponent provided naman the affidavit that it was posted in the 521 newspaper for 2 (two) consecutive weeks, that is consistent with the DAO 2017-15, I think we should 522 proceed with program proper and Sir as Atty. Lao have said, your concerns are duly noted. It will be 523 included sa documentation ng public hearing po nating.

# 525 Atty. Reeza Singson:

526 Mr. Tabada, may be recognized?

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- 528 Engr. Dexter Tabada:529 Ma'am, I think na address
- 529 Ma'am, I think na address naman po yung queries natin kanina,.... 530

# 531 Atty. Reeza Singson:

Well, actually not. Not yet. As I was one who asked the initial question, I just need to say that my questions were not actually addressed fully. So for example, was the newspaper in which the publication was made a newspaper general circulation, so the proponent has not answered that yet. Number 2 was the hard copy of the draft EIS furnished to the stakeholders, the proponent does not address that yet Sir. So considering that this are jurisdictional questions, pag hindi po nasagot yan ay walang jurisdiction po ang EMB, kayo po. Wala po kayong jurisdiction to conduct this public hearing today.

540 With regards to the practice ng EIS, nakalagay naman po sa notice namin where can it be access 541 no? yung mga links dun sa website natin and yung mga offices kung saan po sila pwedeng pumunta. 542 Kasi EIS is a very highly technical document, kaya ang inaattached po natin sa mga invitation letter 543 po natin is the Executive Summary and ito pong public hearing is the venue to present sa mga 544 stakeholders natin kung ano yung project.

## 546 Ian Rivera

So Carlo, are you saying na hindi na comply yung question ni Atty. Reeza? Kasi you are not answering directly. Kung nabigyan ban g kopya ng EIS ang mga impacted barangay.

## 550 Engr. Carlo Arida:

Sir, nakalagay sa notice kung saan po sya pwedeng iaccess. Ang naibigay lang Sir dun

## 553 Ian Rivera:

554 That is really different, hindi lahat ng barangay makakaaccess, that really different. So let us put that 555 on the record. That the requirement on the jurisdiction were not addressed. If you want to proceed, 556 just be address the question first, that put into record the answer to the question of Atty. Reeza.

## 558 Atty. Renato Behimente:

559 Mr. Dexter, may we be allowed to proceed since this matters are already been ruled by the hearing 560 officer and as the opposition has been recognized? Sir, we are ready to share our power point 561 presentation Sir. Thank you.

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# 563 lan Rivera

Sir, Sir, just to make it official, that many of the jurisdictional issues were not settled in this public hearing.

# 567 Atty. Abbas Lao:

Noted po, noted po. All the legal issues raised are noted. We will include it in our report.

#### 569 570 **Ian Rivera**

Thank you Atty. Lao

# 573 Atty. Reeza Singson:

May we have a formal ruling po for the record.

# 576 Atty. Renato Behimente:

I think it is already answered

# 579 Atty. Reeza Singson:

As I've said not yet, I just want a formal ruling from the EMB please.

# 582 Engr. Dexter Tabada:

583 Ma'am I think nasagot naman po kanina yung mga questions and I think our hearing officer has given 584 the enough explanation on the queries, so for now ma'am I think we can proceed with the....

## 586 lan Rivera

Dexter, hindi nga nasagot kanina e, ang clear ng question ni Atty. Reeza, hindi nga nasagot. Kaya nga ang tinatanong, can you come up with the ruling. So if you want to proceed, you come up with the ruling.

Ang tanong kasi dun sa jurisdictional requirements ay hindi nasagot clearly, ang sagot ni Carlo ay nasa website no. Hindi ang hinihingi ng batas ay mabigyan ng hard copy ang mga barangay officials. ## 603 Ian Rivera:

- 504 So meaning to say, you stating noted those questions, those question on jurisdiction were not 505 complied. Were not complied when you say noted. Because there are no clear questions e. Hindi 506 nyo nasagot ng appropriately e. So that means that when you say noted, the questions on the 507 jurisdiction is raised by the groups here were not complied.
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# 609 Atty. Renato Behimente:

610 We have to object on that statement Dexter, I think it was clear earlier, ah Atty. Lao I am just waiting 611 Atty. Law's confirmation and ruling that the proponent has compliant as far as EMB is concern, that 612 is why we being allowed to proceed with the presentation proper and we are just waiting for a queue 613 **Ian Rivera:** 

614 here Mr. Dexter that we will have to proceed. Anyways, as explained by the hearing officer, the 615 opportunities for the details will be later on entertained by the EMB. With that I leave discretion to

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You raised about point of order na ang tanong nga is raised to EMB, tapos ikaw yung sasagot? Na you are part of the proponent.

#### 629 Atty. Abbas Lao:

630 Excuse me po no, I kwan na lang natin yan, and as I have said, we recognize the issues raised by 631 Atty. Reeza Singson, Atty. Chito Trillanes, and Ian Rivera. We recognized and put on record your continuous opposition to this proceedings but as far as this public hearing is concern as already 632 633 shown to us by the project proponent, they have already proof of publication which is a presumption 634 that they have complied the required publication. With regards to the furnishing of the hard copy of the EIS documents to the concern stakeholders as mentioned to us by Carlo that they have already 635 636 published he public hearing in the website of EMB with the information document particularly the EPRMP and other documents are all available to the website of the Environmental Management 637 638 Bureau and as also confirmed by a sino ba yung barangay na yun that they have already received 639 the notice of this public hearing.

As hearing officer, I will rule that we will continue the public hearing subject to the continuous opposition of the group of Ma'am Reeza Singson, Chito Trillanes and Ian Rivera po. So it means that the result of this public consultation or public hearing is without prejudice to the resolution of their opposition by the EMB Central Office, so that is my ruling as far as this public hearing is concern.

Good Morning every one, My name is Ana Miso and I am going to present about our company and
the flow of the presentation would be, present the Company Overview, Project Impact and Benefits
of the FDC Misamis Coal Plant, then our Proposed Power Plant Expansion Project.

To start of, as you can see in the slide, that is our shift yard captured in the evening. In the next slide, I will give you the brief Over View of FDC Misamis Power Corporation.

FDC Misamis Corporation is part of Fillnvest Group, one of the leading conglomerate in the
Philippines with interest in properties, banking, services, infrastructure, sugar and power. FDC
Misamis Power Corporation, currently owns and operation a 3 x 135 MW CFB Power Plant in
Villanueva. It was granted ECC with certificate and our plant has an existing contracts with 17
distribution utilities and 1 industrial customer in Mindanao.

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663 Since the commercial operation of the FDCMPC power plant in 2016, Mindanao has shown strong 664 economic growth, faster than the national average, and with this comes increased energy 665 requirements necessary to sustain this development.

To contribute to the region's continued development, FDCMPC is proposing to expand its currently
3 units into additional of 3 units which is 4, 5, 6 power generating units. With that we will be having a
total of 6 x 135 MW

The Presence of the FDCMPC in the area brought positive impact to its host communities through
 its CSR programs and inherent benefits to its host communities. We focus our CSR program on the
 four pillars of our CSR Frameworks such as Environmental Stewardship, Education for
 Empowerment, Economic Enrichment and Enhance Health Care Initiatives. These four pillars were

675 designed or it has been developed because of the result of the social economic profiling conducted 676 prior to the plant operation. And the succeeding slides will show you some of the CSR programs we 677 implemented.

As to the Economic Enrichment programs, we have utilization of our fly ash into a hollow blocks production with the partner organization, then we have our entrepreneur program, we have of course our training programs. We have also our Education Empowerment programs. With this FDC is very active especially in supporting the Dep't of Education's Brigada Eskwela program every year. Amidst pandemic we were still able to support the DepEd.

In terms of Environment, we have different programs like DRR Training programs, Adopt a Estero program, Coastal Clean-up Program, Solid Waste Management Program support to our LGU. In terms of Environmental Stewardship as well, we do have our support the LGU in terms of their Integrated Coastal Management Program where we planted Mangrove, we have coastal clean-up and among others and the big part of our environmental program is we have our Carbon Sink Program where we already planted many trees already in the areas where this project really help us support to help our environment.

Next slide is the other major benefits that this company contributed to our host communities is
 through the ER 1-94. Our host benefits will receive 1centavo per kilowatt of our gross sales. Where
 in this 1 centavo is divided in 2. The 50% is for DLF and the second part of the 50% is for RWMHEEF
 which is their project related to reforestation water management program, then the half is for the
 electrification program. These funds for DLF and RWMHEEF is then allocated based on the equitable
 portion of each host municipalities, region, barangay and other recipient beneficiaries.

Good Morning, this is Roy Perolino, I am here to present the project.

Page No. 24, Basic Information of the Project it a 6 x 153 MW Circulating Fluidized Bed Power Plant,
the location will be here the same site, we have an existing 3 units and the size of it is 6, we have
existing 3 and the expansion is 3

Next Slide please, Project Rationale. The purpose of this project or the rationale of this project is
because Mindanao now was increasing demand of electricity, this maybe because of economic boom
of the region and if there, in fact in Villanueva alone we have couple of companies emerging now, so
with this, it will also increase the demand of our electricity and that is why we are going to build the
expansion

In this slide, this are the project details, we are gonna build expansion in the same location, same technology that we are going to use; the cost would be this much and the project timeline, we are now in a pre-construction phase, this is one of the pre-construction phase that we are doing and right after this if given approval, so we will be starting project implementation and after three years we will be operating.

So this is our site. The site of the expansion and also the site where in we have the 3 units existing.

Project Description, as I have said earlier, we have a 3 additional and there will be additional land to acquire 3 hectares, this is solely for the coal conveyor and the total hectares that we will have for this plan is around 87 hectares and all the major equipment are all the same with our existing like the steam turbine, coal yard, and another ash. We will be using the same jetty.

This is the map of the plant, as you can see at the left side, brown color that is the additional coal conveyor. That land will be acquired that is 3 hectares, some other browns will be the additional facilities, at the right bottom on your screen is the additional ash yard, although this ash yard is already within our perimeter.

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Our Project Alternatives, we do not have a lot of alternatives in power our power plant, but we decided to use the same technology, because we are considering the existing site, where in our site is accessible in land and water transportation. And also we are equip or we are having a lot of experience in running this kind of technology and for almost 6 years the plant has been a working well to us so we have decides to use this same type of technology

739 This is the control, this is our process technology, CFB Circulating Fluidized Bed Technology, this 740 is the process flow. This technology has a built in Pollution Control we called it here CEMS, it is monitoring the flue gas effluent real time. We are also transmitting this data to EMB so that they 741 742 can also monitor it real time, we have the cone addition, such coal has soft so we will inject 743 limestone to remove the sulfur. As Circulating Fluidize Bed Boiler is a low furnace bed boiler so the 744 risk of having NOx is very less and aside from it CFB also is having a complete combustion that is 745 why carbon monoxide emission is very very minimal because of this combustion efficiency and also 746 the other effect of that the CFB can handle high quality of coal, we can feed various type of coal. 747 Our ashes are collected with our trucks going to our ash yard and that's all. Thank you

753 Magandang umaga po sa inyong lahat, Im Ed Alabastro, with me is Lorie, Rachel, Hazel. Let me 754 proceed, with my presentation and allow you time to ask questions seem a little bit later, alright.

May we start with the study are, just to make a representation of the study area is the project site
and the project area of the existing project to emphasize that we are withinin a mandated project
study area.

Impact areas we have delineated the impact area based on DAO 2003-30 and 2017-15 directly briefly
the direct impact areas are both a portion of Macajalar Bay and portion of Tagoloan River as well as
the flame of the pollution of air pollution discharge. And the indirect impact areas population centers
and social centers, people meaning.

We just take to where this impact areas are in the disturbance, potential disturbance of access/haul
roads, these are in Sta Cruz Tagoloan; Air quality potential degradation in San Martin and Balacanas
Villanaueva, Sta Cruz and Baluarte Tagoloan; Solid and Domestic waste in Tambobong and
Balacana Villanueva.

The indirect impact areas, the major ones are perceive threat public safety and health and the potential impact area geographically is Tambobong and Balacanas, Villanueva. But more importantly, the social impact which are positive barangays 12 in Villanueva and 10 in Tagoloan which are beneficiaries of ER 1-194.

- The key study module as prescribed in the procedural manual are the Land, Water, Air and People which we have put in our EIS report of more specifically EPRMP report.
- And this is the impact on Land: no major impact because land is already well developed and there are no issues with respect with ECA or land tenure. No settlers, no devaluation of land values.
- Geology: The most important aspect in geology is that the site is already well developed and thereare no major changes in the geological feature of the land. There is the map, all in the EIS report.

For the inducement of Hazards: These are well taken into consideration. It is rather notable that in the many years of operation of the original power plant more than 5, we are not aware of any major hazards in the project site. Nevertheless, in the interest of glaring piece in an EPRMP report, we did in fact list down this potential geo hazard, such as flooding even tsunamis and we present it as you may see the map of the hazard assessment based on MGB.

On Terrestrial Ecology, we as the EIS preparer see either nearer to insignificant impact because
 again the land is already developed, therefore the vegetation, flora and fauna, animals etc. have
 been either addressed to in the first and original project.

On construction phase, we do not see any major impact in floral ecology, change in landform and
 solid waste generation during the construction phase, like wise minimal impact on spent non hazardous waste generation. We address nevertheless by observing Republic Act 9003 and RA
 6969 these is for hazardous wastes.

Now the Expansion project operations phase, hazardous waste we do not see nor assess any major
impact. To be focus are bottom and fly ash, the fly ash will be...Management will xxx before the xxx
repository pond.

802 Monitoring stations we want to show you the six monitoring stations. To impress upon you as we 803 have done ourselves and on EMB that we did make and considered a comprehensive monitoring 804 stations not only in terms of distance, but in terms of locations.

Results of the marine water, generally compared with the DENR standard. Shown by the graphs and 806 807 evidence that the self-monitoring reports as our contain in the EIS report. Same thing here in terms of water quality. By the way I've been introduced to you if I'm not mistaken, as Dr. Edgardo G. 808 Alabastro, Team Leader of the EIA prepare team. These are the results of the fresh water quality 809 810 monitoring indicating general compliances with DENR standards. Also, groundwater quality 811 monitoring. Yes, in compliance with the standards. Okay, groundwater quality again in general compliance. Yes. Okay, Again trends of the groundwater quality monitoring. Yes, Air quality 812 813 monitoring ambient air for the last five years, generally in compliant. Yes, based on Air Dispersion 814 Modelling, okay the isoplets show compliances with Republic 87-49 in the Philippine Clean Air Act. 815 That is another evidence of the air dispersion modelling results. Air Quality, stack monitoring this 816 are the trends. Noise is not a major issue as we say it and even at the compliances with the noise standards. I saw the some mitigation for the construction phase, short term but compliances will be 817 818 made. Operations phase, Ambient Air, yes use of the tested CFB technology and of the results of 819 the many years of preparation for the best phase of the FDCMP.

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821 I thought I would flash to you what has been done in terms of monitoring of socio-economic activities822 shown in this photographs.

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824 IEC campaign implement that by FDCMP. This is public scoping activity, photographs, there are. 825 Results of the method based on perception surveys that are perceived benefits of course and 826 perceive adverse impact, this as shown here like livelihood, benefits, perception of flood, if I may say 827 traffic congestion perceived adverse impact. So those are the results in terms of the module for 828 people, construction phase, hiring of qualified priority worker in the hiring and of qualified local people. Operations phase, benefits again from SDP. And what we see as the threat to public health 829 830 and safety and sanitation is not deemed as a significant threat. I must repeat the benefits from R 194 831 are rather substantial. So I thought I would flash before you the results of the public scoping, just 832 take a minute or so, just are shown in the screen. 833

889 May I kindly request FDCMP? We have discussed this but I think FDCMP is in better position to reply 890 that.

Republic and a local contractor, where in they are getting fly ash from our operation.

1260 I will explain to you yung issue no. Ang concern kasi ni Brgy. Chairman ng Brgy San Martin is they 1261 are not included in the barangays who were provided by sharing dun sa ER 1-94. Now it was 1262 responded by the project proponent that Brgy San Martin is not actually a host barangay. They are 1263 not entitle to share with the ER 1-94, because no physical infrastructure constructed within the 1264 territorial jurisdiction of Brgy San Martin, although as mentioned by the Brgy Chair they are one of 1265 the I think directly impacted barangay identified by the project proponent. So ang question po is bakit 1266 hindi sila entitled to share with the ER 1-94?

### 1268 Hersey Dela Cruz: 3:20:54

1269 Thank you sir. Actually Sir, yung nga po talaga ang nakalagay sa circular that only yung host kung 1270 saan yung physical, yun mga infrastructure mismo yun ang makakareceive ng shares from the er 1-94. But that is only for the barangay. Remember sir that there is a municipal and provincial shares in 1271 the ER 1-94. So the barangay, yung barangay po ni sir, should have shares coming from the 1272 1273 municipal shares and even sa provincial shares. So wala po dun sa barangay shares kasi walang 1274 physical. But dun sa municipal at provincial dun supposedly then and in terms of ano po, hindi lang 1275 naman monetary, there are also other benefits that the barangays can have as direct impact areas 1276 nung project. Yun po sir, sir kasi po hindi po natin palitan kung ano yung nandun sa circular kasi 1277 defined po kung sino talaga yung bibigyan ng shares. So yun po sir. Thank you po. 1278

So it 1281 was clarified Kap na katurang barangay giud ang naay physical infrastructure nga na tukod muy 1282 entitled to share with ER 1-94. But ang municipal government of Villanueva have share and of course 1283 the provincial government they have also share dun sa ER 1-94. So I hope, it was clarified ang 1284 concern ni Brgy Chair of Brgy San Martin

Ah Sir yung sinabi ni representative ni DOE na sabi pa nya na ang municipality at saka ang province na makareceive ng share ng ER 1-94, dalawa man yan RF at saka RWHEEF, so duon ba namin kukunin ang share naming sa municipality naming at saka a province and share? Ay sinabi man nya, sinabi nya kanina, pangalawa ito magkaiba ba ang DOE circular na refers to STEAG? So yun ang concern ni Kap na while this company is allowing that barangays to share with ER 1-94. Itong isang company which is FDC hindi pwede sa kanila. Can you clarify that ma'am?

Barangay, then Municipality, then Provincial nandun naman po yung sharing, I am sure naman po na yung barangay ninyo ay part nung municipality of Villanueva, so talagang may share po yung lahat ng barangay within this municipality. ### 1349 Atty. Abbas Lao: 3:29:08

Yes, Mr. Ian Rivera from PMCJ is recognize po, you are recognized

### 1352 Ian Rivera: 3:29:16

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1353 Thank you very much Mr. Chair. My question is related to the presentation of Mr. Edgardo Alabastro. 1354 I'm expecting in this public hearing that the presentation should tackle about the environmental impact study, meaning to say that not just discussing the current impacts but since there is an 1355 expansion and the expansion is 6 units of 135 MW that around morethan 800MW of coal capacity. 1356 1357 So there should be study about what would be the impacts, the potential impacts and also a study 1358 or a recommendation on how this impact would be mitigated. But in the presentation of Mr. Alabastro, I cannot see fully explaining what are the potential impacts of this expansion and also how this 1359 1360 potential impacts be mitigated? Which is really, really important because we are talking here about 1361 impacts and this is one of the reason related to this point is the issue on carbon sink which was raised a while ago by our MENRO and the issue about coal ash and the issue about, just discussed a while 1362 ago the impact barangays. So I will start with the carbon sink. In many of the EIS presentation that 1363 1364 we are attended, the proponent, the EIS presentation since the technology is what the proponent as 1365 already mentioned is very familiar to the proponent then in that study, they should have quantified how much carbon dioxide and coal ash that will be extruded from the plant. Coal Ash, by the way 1366 there's two type, there's a fly ash, how much fly ash will be produce within a year of the 24/7 operation 1367 1368 of the coal plant. How much that should be quantified and how will that be captured, because for the benefit of all of us here. The scientific study of the Environmental Panel of Climate Change IPCC 1369 1370 composed of 2000 scientists around the world, come up with a special report called 1.5. And it's available online, ining special report on 1.5. The IPCC scientists said that it's difficult not to continue, 1371 1372 but difficult to continue emitting carbon dioxide. Because ang tibok ka nang planeta is already filled with carbon dioxide or greenhouse gas. And that's why we are experiencing this global warming at a 1373 1374 very, very unprecedented scale. And we experienced the worsening type of typhoons and other impacts. So that's why that the coal technology that should be constructed, should be able to capture 1375 1376 to be able to capture the most no, of this fugitive carbon dioxide and the coal ash. But yet in the 1377 presentation, there's no quantification and even EMB, EMB already has been with so many public 1378 hearing, should be able to quantify that because if you cannot quantify it, then how can you reduce the impacts or mitigate the impacts? That's one and second, Second, in relation to the in relation to 1379 the carbon sink, a carbon sink is not just, it's not just setting up mangroves or protecting mangroves 1380 1381 well others report that there's are there are mangroves being protected. The carbon sink is not just 1382 only about that, the carbon sink is also about the capturing technology of the fluidized technology a circulating fluidized technology that will be set-up and that technology is already common, as I've 1383 1384 said no, that's really really common. So you can really quantify the waste that that will, that will be the product of its operation. It's not clear so that the EIS does not say about that and they are yes is 1385 really really important because it concerns about mitigating kung sa binisaya pa kung sa on nato ma 1386 wag tang ang kanang nahimong impact o epekto mga kadaot na resulta sa operation sa planta lisod 1387 1388 man kaayo nga pasanda nga maapektohan daghang nga mga tao. Ganiha lang ang Brgy Captain sa San Martin gaingon nga sila ay naigo aning mga pollution. That should be that should be reduced 1389 1390 and the reduction is scientifically presented in the EIS. Kay expansion man ne, and un nay un study 1391 scientific study unsa bay madungag nya epekto dito sa kadagatan o kung sa una nya pag mitigate, And the last one is about impact barangays, the impact barangays is scientifically determined and 1392 1393 this is determined according to the EIS, because the EIS is your scientific way of making the study 1394 of the impacts. So the impact barangays is not just determined by the Department of Energy circular. 1395 It should be determined by the study how many barangays that will be affected in terms of the impacts 1396 of on groundwater kay ang planta mo kuha man sya tubig fresh water ang planta kag circulating fluidized bed mana. So pinaka litro or millions of litres of water that it will consume throughout the 1397 1398 year og kung sama na mahimong epekto sa water table as a water table diha sa Villanueva. Ug ka 1399 impact sa water table dito sa mga residente na nagsaligsa ug tubig at sa mga water source. So that 1400 should be that should be quantified. And that should be quantified how much water fresh water that 1401 it will use and how much water the hot water that it will read. It will dump into the into the sea 1402 remember na ag init na tubig once it will reach the sea, it will affect various marine life if there are still marine life because there are already existing coal plants they're operating. Um, so back to that 1403 1404 impacted barangay it should be scientifically scientifically determined. And and that's that's the 1405 question of the barangay Captain here in San Martin because if you can see in the Google map on

1406 the Google Earth, San Martin and the Brgy San Martin is the barangay nearest to the coal plants and 1407 to the two coal plants right now. And if that if there will be an expansion Barangay San Martin is the 1408 is the nearest in terms of distance? So we were able to measure that how how, how are the barangay San Martin to the to existing coal plants it's less than 300 meters so less than 300 meters and how 1409 can that be that they can they cannot be considered impacted barangays. So I'm surprised because 1410 1411 that should be a result of a thorough EIS. So when you do the EIS and go around doing the study, 1412 then by by visual, by ocular, you can really, look, what are the barangays that are nearest to the 1413 plant. And one of the barangay is Brgy Baluarte, and they're also fisherfolks in Barangay Baluarte. So I found that the EIS presented here, that the EIS is really, really insufficient. Considering how that 1414 1415 impacts what are the impacts, the quantification of the impacts, and how this impacts will potentially impacts will be reduced in relation to barangay San Martin issues. I'm really I'm surprised by 1416 barangay San Martin is not considered as an impacted barangay we're in fact, it's the nearest 1417 barangay compared to other barangays right now. I think there's a need to for the Department of 1418 1419 Energy to update what what they define as impacted in relation to Villanueva is that are the two 1420 barunga is that the considered host barangays are still existing barangays territorially, because what 1421 we learn that these barangay territorially are no longer there. It's already occupied by the coal power, coal power plants operating right now. And the the residents will move somewhere else. Do we move 1422 somewhere else? Okay. That's all for now. I might say my questions a while later. 1423

### 1425 Atty. Abbas Lao: 3:40:35

1426 Thank you. Thank you Mr. Ian Rivera for that very intensive question, to reiterate the question is 1427 directed to the presentation of Dr. Alabastro regarding the perceived impact of the proposed 1428 expansion of the project. How this impact will be mitigated by the project proponent? So ang mga detailed of the question of Mr. Rivera is first quantify the emission of fly ash and how it will be 1429 1430 captured in the carbon sink program of the project? Second is a carbon sink, not just protecting the 1431 mangrove, but the capturing of the carbon that will be in the plant especially that yung operation nila 1432 is double from the original approved capacity of the project. Third is wala daw mapresent yung study 1433 on the impact of the proposed expansion on marine resources. I have seen in the presentation na 1434 vung sa impact na pinresent ni Dr. Alabastro na parang may expansion dun sa intake at saka outfall ng cooling water nila. Then forth na niraise ni Mr. Rivera is the determination of the impact barangay 1435 1436 should not be based on ER 1-94 of DOE, but it should be based on the impact study of the project. So, I hope Dr. Alabastro is listening and can you give us enlightenment as far as the issues raised 1437 1438 by Sir Ian Rivera. 1439

## 1446 Dr. Edgardo Alabastro: 3:43:20

1447 May I also FDCMP respond to the question of the gentleman which we do recognize. Maybe I should explain that the contents of the EPRMP are all based on the technical screening 1448 1449 requirements one by one without any exception. Any it has passed through a review committee evaluation, which is did you answer in simple terms, the EIS preparer answer in with the revised 1450 1451 procedural manual. In other words Sir, we duly recognize your question the EIS preparer, which I represent did actually comply with all the requirements. Unfortunately, maybe we only have a few 1452 1453 hours to discuss, but it's all embedded in the EIS report. In fact, procedurally, if our EIS report did not meet the requirements, so special requirements and based, if I may say so my 30 years of 1454 1455 experience with Philippine EIS system, we could not have done this far and I don't think EMB would 1456 have allowed the conduct of a public hearing. Again, sir, I'm invoking my 30 years of experience with the Philippine EIS system, the starting from each exception at one time also and your 1457 committee member. Let me say these with respect to the identification of the impact area, the 1458 1459 identification of the impact area, the barangays were was based on the DAO 2003-30 and DAO 1460 2017-15. So Sir, those are for the record, are the responses of the EIA prepare and maybe I could defere to the proponent on matters relating to carbon sink. So that's it for me at this time. Thank 1461 1462 you very much.

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### 1464 Atty. Abbas Lao: 3:45:50

1465 Ah, sir, while we appreciate your answer, but I understand that your presentation is just a summary 1466 of the environmental impact assessment or EPRMP prepared for the project expansion but can you give us a detail of the detailed question based by Mr. Ian Rivera? Yes, we understand that your 1467 1468 presentation is limited because you cannot of course present to us the whole EPRMP but, I hope you could response dun po sa mga specific issues raised by Mr. Rivera, no, you have already 1469 replied dun sa impact Barangay as you have said it is in accordance with the specific guidelines of 1470 1471 EMB so we recognize that answer. Yung first for na issued ni Mr. Rivera is the quantification of the 1472 emission of fly ash and yung mitigating measures on how to capture that because, yes yung project 1473 originally ano lang yan uhm, three kuwan lang yan, so you are expanding it 100% so shempre yung emission nung fly ash a 100% din matataas yun. So ang concerned po ni Mr. Rivera is hindi niya 1474 1475 nakita dun sa presentation mo kung ano yung quantification if you have quantification of the fly ash 1476 that will be generated as a consequence of the expansion of the projects at ano yung proposed ng company na capturing in relation to the carbon sink. Yun yung isang issue nya. Another issue is 1477 1478 ah. 1479

May I please, excuse me po. Can I answer one by one para po for sure?

### 1483 Atty. Abbas Lao: 3:48:01

1484 Yes Sir, Please 1485

### 1486 Dr. Edgardo Alabastro: 3:48:02

1487 Yung pong tungkol sa quantification and please andyan po ang FDCMP nag usap na kami and how it has been handled. If kung fly ash, are two ways of quantifying, one you take the volume in tons/hr 1488 of the feed coal and then you get the percentage of the fly that is quantification. Straight arithmetic 1489 1490 straight steo chemistry po and the other way is based on experience because FDCMP has already 1491 has experience on fly ash generation that is the simple answer to quantification. Straight chemistry and experience. As to the management, It was also said that the fly ash is being taken by third 1492 1493 party for re-use as evidence by existing and proposed contracts. So, it will be taken by the party for 1494 their own beneficial and environmentally friendly use. So, yun po ang answer ko, unless PDCMP my want to correct me, please do so or expand. FDCMP? 1495 1496

### 1497 Atty. Abbas Lao: 3:49:23

1498Thank you very much Dr. Alabastro. no another another technical concern issue raised by Mr.1499Rivera, is yun pong impact of the proposed expansion dun sa marine resources natin, it seems that1500wala po kayong na present dun sa presentation nyo but I am sure it is part of the environmental1501impact study prepared by the EIA preparer. Ano po yung impact dun sa marine resources natin1502as far as the expansion is concerned any detailed baka po pwede mong i-enlighten yung participant1503natin.

### 1505 Dr. Edgardo Alabastro: 3:50:10

Thank you, and again thanks to the gentleman who asked the guestion. Ang impact po sa marine 1506 1507 species or fish corals are identified as the most significant species this base on thermal impact. During construction there are no additional jettuy, So hindi ma da-damage and corals. Okay, if there 1508 1509 are restructures like applied to the constructed design engineering details, which are undertaken 1510 post ECC, we ascertain, that the columns and the structure that will hold the pipe will not damage destroy any corals during the construction stage. During the operation states, constructed na po 1511 yung structure, which is nothing more than pipeline the impact that we have review is the impact of 1512 Thermal, kasi wala naman pong substance walang chemicals na lumalabas sa planta going to 1513 Macajalar Bay, wala po ang tubig po ay hinihigop sa Macajalar Bay at binabalik lamang. Ang 1514 1515 process water po ay Tagoloan River, bumabalik din po sa Tagoloan. On thermal impact ginawan 1516 na din po naming ng study na nagpakita na duon babagsak ang tubig, of course slightly elevated, wala pong significant amount of corals. So yun po ang aming pinag-aralan at dahil nga po sa corals, 1517 ipinaliwanag lamang po sa aming summary na na no impact. Pero salamat po sa inyong tanong at 1518 1519 hopefully po nasagot na naming ito.

Thank you very much, Dr. Alabastro for that enlightenment no, so I hope that Mr. Ian Rivera po is listening and satisfied with the answer of the preparer with regards to the issues raised by Mr. Rivera.

### 1528 1529 Ian Rivera: 3:52:27

1530 Thank you, thank you Mr. Chair. I'm familiar with the EIS, because we've been allot to studying EIS is in many of the coal-fired power plants in the Philippines. And when we say impacts, it's really, 1531 really specific to a certain site, where the plant will be constructed. When we say it is specific is to 1532 1533 determine the impact, a baseline should be established first. Because how can you determine the impact if you have no baseline? So that's that's that's exactly what we mean scientifically when we 1534 say impact. But, to the to our gentleman prepare of the EIS, Sir Alabastro. What I am asking here 1535 1536 is this specific to that plant that will be constructed in Villanueva. Since there are already, there are it's a six units of 135. So, it's the impacts should be guantified or guantified like how much? You 1537 1538 know, again, I'm going to repeat it. How much coal ash are we talking about now is the nine, nine, the coal ash pan that's being constructed when will accommodate the the coal, the coal ash as a 1539 1540 byproduct of the operation. For all of us here, let us be reminded that coal ash is a coal ash is a 1541 hazardous, it's a hazardous waste. It's considered by the Environmental Protection Agency of the US as a hazardous waste. And that's how that coal ash pan will be constructed to make sure that 1542 the coal ash that the coal ash will not will not penetrate the water table. Once the coal ash will 1543 1544 penetrates the water table, it will contaminate the water table that will be consumed. I know that every most of us here is aware on that. It will contaminate the water source of the residence in 1545 Villanueva. So those are important, those are important to be established the quantification, the 1546 baseline, and how and how this new construction, will add on those impacts. Second, second, 1547 because I'm talking here about science, the second is carbon dioxide, because carbon dioxide 1548 1549 warms the planet no iyang gapainit ang atong kalibutan xxxxxglobal warming garon at ang mga scientists in inter governmental Panel on Climate Change, nagsultingan pa ug carbon dioxide didto 1550 sa atmosphere, ok lang na gi capture sya. So quantify na to. Since FDC already claiming they're 1551 1552 familiar with this kind of technology, then they should be familiar on the quantification. So far, Mr. 1553 Chair, that the study does not sufficiently answer the question and the question about impacts should be addressed, because we are dealing here with with the people are living near the coal 1554 plant. 1568 On the quantification of the coral, and how it is manage it this very well written report, my I get help, 1569 of my FDCMP, somebody tell me, what is the number what is the amount and how it handled. I have 1570 said so that may be you as proponent you did the qualification, xxx the answer. Because we, you 1571 reviewed my report.

### 1573 Hazel Alvarez: 3:57:58

- 1574 Uhm Doc, yeah, can I answer? This is Hazel from FDC
- 15751576 Atty. Abbas Lao: 3:58:04

1577 Yes ma'am. Yes, ma'am. Hazel, can you please give us a detailed 1578 explanation with regards to the issue at hand, please.

### 1580 Hazel Alvarez: 3:58:18

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1581 I don't have here with me the actual figures from the plant operation, but I'm sure it's lowered of what the ball figure that I'm going to use. So if we are using coal from Indonesia of 4500 Gar and 1582 10% of this coal consumption will be resulted to ash. So estimating are 2000 kilograms per unit per 1583 day of operation and then assuming that it's 90% availability full load for the whole day. So 90% fly 1584 1585 ash and 10% bottom ash from the 10% ash from the coal volume, and we have here 24 hectares 1586 area 15 from this and then nine for the expansion. If we will account that the six units will all be operational for full load for the whole day, we can assume point eight meters per day for the six 1587 units. But as initially advised awhile ago, we have ongoing agreements with Holsim, Republic 1588 cement and a local contractor where the fly ash are being taken off. And from last year our full load 1589 projection was not realized because of this pandemic. And so far because the plant is in the open 1590 area. All the locals can easily observe if our quantity will exceed whatever we have right now 1591 1592 existing dike and not vet considered the expansion area of nine hectares to 12 hectares additional 1593 Ash pond. Thank you.

### 1595 Atty. Abbas Lao: 4:01:04

1596Thank you very much Ma'am Hazel for that enlightenment. No. So I hope the concern raised by Mr.1597Rivera is address. But I am also do we have representative from the RevCom were present on this1598public hearing they might give us enlightenment. As far as the issue race is concerned. I'm sure it1599was extensively subjected to the evaluation and review of the review committee. Do we have1600representatives here?

### 1602 Chito Trillanes: 4:01:55

Mr. Chairman, may be recognized in relationship to the answer of Professor Alabastro, sir.

### 1605 Atty. Abbas Lao: 4:02:06

All right. Yes, Is that a questions Sir Chito?

## 1608 Chito Trillanes: 4:02:12

1609 Yes, yes, sir. I'm in the presentation. Sir. I do not see. Detailed presentation on the impact study on 1610 health. That's why I'm interested in relation to the issue raised by Mr. Rivera, as an experienced 1611 mine auditor in some mining companies. I was very keen on observing the the impact of the 1612 operations on the health of the population, especially in the host, directly impacted areas. And I 1613 think this is vital information. That's why we raise the issue whether or not the EIS hardcopy has 1614 been issued to the residents, especially the barangays nearby of the project, so that they can see themselves what is the savvy in relation to health. So the issues on health would focus more on 1615 cardiovascular, Pulmonary and gastrointestinal because, as far as I have mentioned, during mine 1616 1617 audits, I observed there is really no aggravation of the health conditions of people residing nearby 1618 these plants. So hope this will be addressed. And I hope to see the impact study of this. Thank you, 1619 Mr. Chair.

1622 Thank you. Thank you very much. Mr. Chito Trillanes for that very significant question. No, so yes 1623 I understand that even before the the environmental impact assessment for the original project was preferred, I'm sure there is a baseline data conducted by the project proponent on the health within 1624 the constituents of the host barangays, and municipalities. So, yes, it is really valid question that 1625 1626 considering that the plant has already operated and then they are now planning to expand their 1627 capacity of their operation, I think it should be included in the environmental, I mean, in the EPRMP 1628 if there is impact of the initial operation of the plant on the health of the host barangay and the municipalities. And of course, it will be related to the proposed expansion of the project. So, do we 1629 1630 have included that in the impacts? Dr. Alabastro please.

That is correction and we did not ignored that, and thanks to the question raised by Mr. Trillanes.

Sir, no, Dr. can you please reiterate or repeat your question? Kasi naka off po yung microphone kanina hindi nacaptured that is for record purposes and for the benefit of the participant paki repeat po yung answer mo dun.

1641 Mr. Chair, my kindly respond that, indeed the matter of health and the possible or potential impact 1642 of the project on the health of the people are included in the EPRMP report including the baseline. So they are there. Okay, that's what I could say. As a matter of fact 1643

1645 1646 Okay, thank you. Thank you very much, Dr. Alabastro. So it was confirmed, sir, Chito Trillanes that 1647 there is indeed health assessment included in the EPRMP. Although it was not presented yung detail nya po, which is significant information as far as the constituents of the barangay the 1648 municipalities concerned. So I hope nandun po yung sa detailed EPRMP yung Health Study. Yung 1649 1650 current operation of the plant, and of course, the proposed expansion.

Mr. Chair, maybe we be furnished of the copy of that, specifically on the impact on health. We're 1653 1654 interested in that because we want to confirm on the apprehension of Mr. Rivera, that the the operation you'd have really impacted the health status of the constituents in that area. So the best 1655 1656 thing is that we want to see the the records from the DOH, even in the municipal health office, not 1657 only the FDC kami meron sila, they are required to retain a copy of that but we want it confirmed 1658 by the Department of Health personnel because if we could see you know, adverse impacts on health we will request for a deep study. So magkakaroon po ng isang intensive study on the real 1659 costs of you know, cardiovascular infections or whatever that could be related to the Cardio 1660 1661 Pulmonary and gastrointestinal impulse of the inhabitants. Thank you Mr. Chairman.

1682 Sige po, you are recognized again, Mr. RIvera

### 1684 Ian Rivera: 4:10:36

1685 Thank you Mr. Chair, This is precisely why we were asking because it is not clearly stated in that document he mentioned and that is the reason why we are raising it here again. I am asking in 1686 1687 relation to the procedure. When will be a public hearing that will happen, that this specific question can be thoroughly be answered by the proponent and the preparer because this are really, really 1688 essential questions, the questions in impacts. I think it is not just OK particularly for the impacted 1689 1690 municipality and the barangays an answer that is of very very general this is the reason why we



proceeded with this public hearing in order to hear the presentation of the study. So knowing that, it
is not well articulated and we cannot see that in the document that he mentioned. I am seeing that it
is really really insufficient the presentation and I believed in the interest of the welfare, the health of
the impacted barangays, there should be a period that they should be articulated and presented well.
Thank you Mr. Chair for this opportunity.

1698 Yes, Thank you Mr. Ian Rivera for that concern no, I think, yes you are correct that it should be detailed presented during public hearing, considering the constrain of this pandemic, virtual lang po 1699 1700 tayo sa presentation. Although this is a virtual conduct of the public hearing and public scoping is 1701 actually covered by memorandum issued by EMB Central Office. However, as I have said if you think 1702 that you have detailed issue pertaining to the content of the baseline studies. I presumed that you 1703 already have a copy of it and if you still concerned that you really see that it is very significant to be expound or included Environmental Impact study of the proposed project, I think you can still submit 1704 it sir to the EMB Central Office because any issues and concern pertaining to the proposed project 1705 is still entertained by the EMB Central Office. It will be explained to you by Dexter Tabada later kung 1706 1707 ano yung process po after this public consultation. Because any stakeholders who are not satisfied 1708 to the conduct of the Environmental Impact study or the EPRMP they are still allowed to submit their 1709 issues and concern that gusto nilang incorporate sa EIS document and I hope the members of the Review Committee is present to this public hearing so that they can also the study indeed na address 1710 1711 yung issues and concern raised by the participants particularly dun sa health impact of the project 1712 raised by Sir Chito Trillanes.

Maayong udto sa tanan, this is in relation po dun sa bilang electric consumer naman, actually madami po akong question pero gusto ko lang i-highlight yung isa sa mga 1730 I think pinakaimportanteng pangutana or concern nga gusto ko I put forward. Because kanina po, na 1731 1732 mention ni Engr. Perolino kanina na dahil sa pangangailangan o paginahang sa kuryente, bantog nay expansion o kaya ine-expand ung coal-fired powe plant. Kami po sa PMCJ, last year may study 1733 1734 po kaming ginawa na as of 2020 ang Mindanao po any mayroong dependable capacity na 4013.25MW and yung contracted capacity po nyan ay around 1813.26MW. Nalaman po natin last 1735 vear sa study na ginawa ng PMCJ Mindanao, meron pong sobra-sobrang kuryente or excess 1736 dependable capacity yung buong Mindanao na around 2199.98MW and almost 60 or 70% po ng 1737 1738 kuryento po ay galing sa coal-fired power plant. Kaya po siguro ang itatanong ko po, Bakit po 1739 kailangan pa naming ng coal-fired power plant? We're coming from the Mindanao Development Plans, they had two scenarios, high growth scenario and low growth scenario. These are pre-pandemic and the project was pre-pandemic. We're coming from the high growth scenario of 9.6% GDP growth and a low growth scenario of 7.1. From there they presented 2018 to 2040 energy requirement of the region based on the optimistic economic development. Yun yung rason why we wanted to contribute to the continue development of Mindanao. Recognizing that with the high growth development, we need energy, we need power. This is why FDC Misamis is proposing the project.

1768 Thank you, ma'am for that enlightenment. Any representative from Department of Energy who can 1769 further expound the issue raised by ma'am Rara Ada?

Good Afternoon Sir,

### 1774 Atty. Abbas Lao: 4:20:30

Yes ma'am, Hershey, you are recognized po. Can you give us or expound the issue raised by ma'am Rara Ada of PMCJ that based on the study po, there is no shortage of electricity or energy requirement particularly in Mindanao, but it is one of the justification of the project proponent that they proposing the project that there is indeed shortage of energy requirement in Mindanao. Can you give us or enlighten that issue?

### 1781 Hershey Dela Cruz: 4:21:05

Yes Sir, as the representative from FDC has they used the high growth scenario which would really 1782 entail additional require additional capacity. And yung additional capacities naman po, it actually 1783 really depend on the proponent on what type of project they will implement. For the case if FDC, it's 1784 1785 coal but there are also some other proponent who would implement renewable energy projects. So, 1786 in terms of energy selection depends on the proponent already. For the Department of Energy, what 1787 we do is we just project what is the required demand depending on the historical and projected economic growth. So yun po yung sa DOE. And it depend din po kasi kung kalian mag come on 1788 1789 stream yung project. At present as Ms. Rara said, there is excess capacity, actually if there is no 1790 pandemic, we would not have that much excess capacity. If we will have continuous growth, then 1791 economic growth, then we would need additional power. But in terms of technology selection, it really 1792 depend on the project proponents. So yun po, thank you.

Ma'am thank you very much for that enlightenment. I hope the concern of ma'am Rara Ada of PMCJ is addressed. To proceed with any other concern from the participants?

Actually, in response to Ms. Rara, Department of Energy has also issued a circular on the moratorium
 for Greenfield Coal Projects. Because as per our assessment also within the department there is
 really excess coal capacities already.

### 1809 Rara Ada: 4:23:41

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1810 Salamat po sa DOE, pero kasi yung ano yung mga existing power supply agreements na nagsasabi na kaya nilang suportahan o supplyan ng kuryente ang Mindanao ay hanggang ano po, yung mga 1811 kontrata ng mga electric cooperatives of mga distribution utilities between generation companies like 1812 1813 FDC ay aabot hanggang 2030 and beyond na sinasabi na until 2030 ay may enough supply ng kuryente "Mindanao". And then isa sa mga analysis and findings po kasi naming, ang sabi nung 1814 isang expert na kasama naming na from Ateneo De Davao Univeristy. 1860 Mindanao, so we anticipate that by 2005 and beyond mangangailangan ang Mindanao Grid ng kuryente. We're basing our projections on that and we're hoping that during construction period and 1861 1862 during the development period magkakaroon po ng competitive selection process ang mga 1863 distribution utilities and we intend to participat on those CSPs. Ang tanong ko lang, kasi sabi sa FDC ni Mr. Fernandez 2017 na itong proposed 810MW is projection nila sa possible energy need in the future, now ang tanong ko. How does that fit in with the current excess capacity ng mga power generating companies and 2018 2019 with the fact also to couple with the fact also na it has always been process na nauuna yung 2020 pagcontract nila ng PSA before the plant here is built para naman I understand na that is an 2021 assurance na mayroong customer, mayroong need kung ano yung pino-produce nila. Now ngayon by their own mission, sabi nila itong 810MW wala pa daw silang contractor. So ang nakita ko lang, 2022 dadagdag pa ito sa excess nagiging produce na ngayon which is already doubled sa mga contracted 2023 2024 energy distribution utilities.

FDC is not accredited establishment of Philippine Economic Zone Authority.

Ok thank you very much. That is the end of our open forum for this public consultation, so just to reiterate yung mga issues raised during the public forum:

Raised issued by Hon Ello regarding additional ash disposal, yung additional carbon footprint of 2126 2127 which it was also answered by the project proponent, the FDC that they have also proposed expansion of their existing ash disposal area more or less 9 hectares yung proposed ash disposal 2128 2129 area nila and with regards to the expansion of carbon sink program. They are already negotiating with the concern barangays of Villanueva and other Local Government Units for the expansion of 2130 2131 their carbon sink area. They have also in coordination of other university, na mayroon po silang area for the carbon sink and it was also mentioned that National Power Corporation is also 2132 negotiated with the FDC for the possible expansion of their carbon sink program. 2133
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  2. Question is dun sa SDP Social Development Program, also raised by Mr. Ello. It was also answered by the project proponent. On the Employment issue according to Mr. Ello, only 30% employment rate of the Local Government Unit of Villanueva and he is requesting to have definite percentage for transparency purposes and it was assured by the project proponent that with regards to the employment they will closely coordinate with the Local Government Unit of Villanueva
- On the issue raised by Hon Jeric Emano, this is regarding the tax payment of FDC to LGU which
   based on the graphical presentation of FDC, medyo bumaba sya CY 2019 to 2020. But it was

clarified by FDC that the source of their presentation or data nila, I think dun yata sa treasurer
yata ng LGU ng Villanueva. But despite of that they will still clarify further the reason bakit bumaba
yung payment nila ng real estate sa calendar year 2019 to 2021.

- 4. On the issues raised by the Brgy Chair of San Martin, regarding the benefits of the constituents 2145 of Brgy San Marin, particularly duon sa sharing ng ER 1-94 of which Brgy San Martin is not 2146 gualified. It was clarified by the project proponent but only dun sa barangays that have physically 2147 2148 constructed infrastructure is entitled to the sharing of ER 1-94. It was further clarified by the 2149 representative from the DOE, it is only indeed dun sa barangays na may physical structure ng establishment ang qualified to share with ER 1-94. But Brgy San Martin may share through the 2150 2151 sharing of municipality of Villanueva and the province of Misamis Oriental. So pwede po dun sila maki-share, but of course subject to the approval of the municipal government and provincial 2152 2153 government.
  - 5. Regarding naman dun sa risk issue that raised by Mr. Ian Rivera particularly on the presentation of Dr. Alabastro dun sa perceive impact of the proposed expansion, how this impact be mitigated. There are 4 main questions issues raised by Mr. Rivera.

 Determination of the impact barangay, the question raised by Mr. Ian Rivera was also clarified by Dr. Alabastro. According to Mr. Alabastro the preparation of EPRMP is accordance with the existing guidelines of the Environmental Management Bureau as well as the determination of impact barangay is not actually based on ER 1-94, but based on the guideline of EMB with regards to the determination of the direct and indirect impact area

1. Quantification of the emission of fly ash and how it will be captured in the preparation

2. Carbon Sink Program not just protecting the mangrove as mentioned by the FDC

- 6. Dun naman sa raised by Mr. Chito Trillanes yung health impact of the project. According to sir Chito it was not expounded in the EPRMP but according to Dr. Alabastro it was included in the EPRMP although the details of which was not explained, but he suggested that Mr. Chito Trillanes submitted the detailed kuwan nila sa EMB so that it may be incorporated in the final draft of the impact on Environmental Impact Study.
- 7. Dun naman sa issue raised by ma'am Rara of PMCJ and concern naman nya is there is no shortage of electric energy in Mindanao based on the study of PMCJ. It was answered by FDC na they are considering the high growth scenario of Mindanao that there would be a possible shortage of energy. It was also clarified by the representative of the DOE na until 2030, Mindanao has enough supply, but as to the type of technology pursued by the supplier of the source of energy, it is the option of the project proponent whether what technology they will use, whether coal or mga hydroelectric power plant.
  - 8. Another issue raised is the power contract. Whether or not is there already a power contract with the propose capacity expansion of the project. It was clarified by Sir Roderick of FDC that wala pa silang kontrata as far as the expansion of the capacity of project is concern.
- 9. Then sa issue raised by Sir Renoir Abrea of MSU Naawan, he asked if there is a study on the impact of the project on corals in the impact area. Although it was confirmed by the representative of Technotrix, consultant and Dr. Alabastro that yes, there were study conducted by Mr. Benji
  Francisco yung Marine Biologist nila although the result of the impact study or the baseline study was not expounded by the project proponent.
- 10. Then dun sa issue ni ma'am Mejos, the District Supervisor of DepEd, her concern is what are the benefits of the learners from the propose expansion of the project. It was confirmed by FDC that they are closely coordinating with DepEd to continue the CSR they are providing to the learners particularly the DepEd. They assured that they will closely coordinating with the DepEd particularly kay ma'am Nilda to continuously provide CSR and support to learners and it was confirmed by ma'am Nilda.
